PACKING AND STORAGE TIPS

- ★ VINYL LETTERING is best kept flat, between two sheets of cardboard.
- ★ If you must roll up VINYL LETTERING, roll with the lettering on the outside.
- ★ BANNERS, especially plastic banners should be rolled onto a carpet tube. If folded, they will develop nasty creases, which are almost impossible to get rid of.
- ★ Caution when using BUBBLE WRAP. It can leave "octopus" marks on painted surfaces.
- ★ Don't slide VINYL LETTERED signs across each other; the edges of the letters will catch and peel the letter. Use a paper or foam slipsheet.
- ★ Don't store PHOTOGRAPHS face to face; the emulsion will cause them to stick together.
- ★ Easy with the SHRINKWRAP; a too tight wrap will warp your sign panels.
- ★ VELCRO TABS can dent the face of foamcore signs. Be sure to stack them back-to-back.
- ★ Protect the CORNERS of your foamcore signs; it's their most vulnerable part.
- ★ Wipe down your CLEAR PLEX graphic panels before you slipsheet them. A little bit of grit can do a lot of damage.
- ★ When packing a can of TOUCH-UP PAINT, secure the lid with tape, then place in a plastic trash bag.
- ★ Remove any stray bits of "live" ADHESIVE TAPE from the backs of your signs, otherwise it will find a way of sticking something together.
- ★ Rolled TRANSPARENCIES should be put in a cardboard tube for protection.
- ★ Avoid putting a LABEL on the face of a foamcore sign; it can rip the paper covering when it's removed.
- ★ UNLAMINATED inkjet prints smudge very easily; don't place them face-to-face, and keep your hands clean when handling them.
- ★ Stick a label on the outside of your ROLLED UP BANNER indicating it's size and copy.
- ★ Before you pack away all those cut-out DIMENSIONAL LETTERS, lay them out once, to make sure you have them all.
- ★ FLOOR GRAPHICS and other large decals should be stored flat if possible. If they must be rolled, roll with the image facing out.
